Without mentioning the marvellous area of **Lessinia**, famous for its trekking and cycling paths, the unique flavour of its cheeses and typical dishes at Alpine huts.

THE NEED TO MOVE

To reach us:



Land at the <u>Verona Valerio Catullo airport</u>, just 20 minutes from Verona and the lake. Take <u>Verona Airlink</u> or a taxi.



Arrive at the <u>Verona Porta Nuova</u> <u>station</u> in the city centre.



Find parking in the section "Parcheggi a Verona" of comune verona.it

Let's explore:



From Porta Nuova, take a regional or high-speed train and reach our lake in just 15 minutes.



Get on one of the buses of the ATV public transport service and move around the lake and in the city. With Verona Card, travelling around Verona is free.



Pedal with <u>Verona Bike</u> on the main cycling paths that connect the city, the lake and inland areas.



Get around the lake on the <u>Navigarda</u>. Find out the sailing schedule in section "Tickets and timetables Lake Garda" of navigazionelaghi.it/en/

As you can see, moving around here is simple. We recommend always moving sustainably.

Experiencing things from multiple points of view

Crossed by the Adige River, which gives the city a magical, romantic atmosphere, Verona is one of the most fascinating art cities in Italy.

Its history stretches back more than two millennia and it is the richest - after Rome - in remains from the Roman era.

Its symbol, the Arena, hosts the most important **Opera Festival** in the world, which makes it "the most Italian place on earth".

It forms part of and oversees the **Great Wine Capitals** network, which encompasses 12 of the top cities and territories in the world of wine.


It is located in a strategic position: it is less than two hours from Milan, Venice, Bologna, the sea, and the Dolomites.

It is a **people-sized city**, almost entirely flat, except for a few panoramic points that reach an altitude of 400 m. The advantage? You can always move around sustainably!

Looking from above

Follow a part of the city walls on the Torricelle, which, along with the typical architecture of the centre, have allowed Verona to become a **UNE-SCO** World Heritage Site.

Walk up high, following the Parco delle Mura, with a must-see <u>urban trekking path</u> through the greenery.

Don't miss the sunset over the entire historical centre from the **Torre dei Lamberti**, where you can reach a height of more than 80 m (even via lift).

From here, you can recognize symbolic places in Verona: Piazza Bra with the Arena, Castelvecchio, Teatro Romano. Piazza Erbe and Piazza dei Signori are at your feet.

Discover Verona with **City Sightseeing**, get on and off all you want and admire the city from another point of view.

Looking upwards

Sail the Adige River together with an expert guide, passing under characteristic bridges such as Ponte Pietra and Ponte Scaligero of Castelvecchio.

Venture through the narrow streets in the historical centre on foot or by bicycle, crossing the historical gates of the city: Porta Borsari, Porta Nuova, Porta Palio, Porta Leoni.

See how the bell tower of the city cathedral stands out and go in to view the marvellous Assumption of the Virgin altarpiece by Titian.

Between one point of view and the next, stop at the Chapter Library, the oldest in the world, and look out from Juliet's balcony.

Visit the city's <u>Civic Museums</u>, don't miss the exhibitions at <u>Palazzo Maffei</u> and the <u>Achille Forti Modern Art Gallery</u>.



Having fixed points

With the <u>Veronacard</u>, you have free access to the main points of interest: the Arena, Juliet's House, historical churches, Castelvecchio, and the Roman Theatre, along with other important discounts.

The card can be purchased online or at authorized points of sale, at IAT VERONA (Tou-

- rist Information Office in Piazza Bra), at the monument ticket offices, Porta Nuova train station, and many tourist facilities.
- The first Sunday of each month (November-March) entrance is reduced to euro 1,00.

The opera season at the Arena begins at June and continues throughout the sum-

mer. Since 2023, the operas Aida, La Traviata, Rigoletto, and Nabucco have been made accessible thanks to free, alternative tools.







- Combine history with food: a sensory trip with tasty stops at special places in Verona.









Cultivating your passions

A paradise of water sports and outdoor activities, the ideal place for food and wine lovers, but also a cultural and artistic destination, the Veneto banks of Lake Garda are the answer for any time you want to dedicate to your passions.

Along 44 km of coastline you can discover over 20 municipalities:

from Malcesine to Peschiera, there are many mustsee lakeside towns. The ideal place for anyone looking for relaxation and tranquillity. Among the beaches, coasts, and uplands, even sports enthusiasts can make the lake their outdoor gym. Beyond the coast: in the inland areas, you can marvel at the panoramas and entirely different views up to an altitude of 2000 metres on Monte Baldo. Here, outdoor activities such as hikes, trekking, climbing, rafting, and cycling await.

Between one passion and the next, taste a glass of Bardolino or Lugana at one of the area wineries and visit an olive-oil mill to learn about all the nuances of Garda extra-virgin olive oil DOP.

- The lakeside municipalities are connected by **bus service** ce and a **ferry service**, **Navigarda**, which is available year round.


Peschiera, a fortified city and UNESCO World Heritage Site, this is a small Roman village and also the starting point for the Mincio Peschiera-Mantova cycle-path, the central junction of the EuroVelo 7 or 'Ciclovia del Sole'.

Valeggio sul Mincio, famous for the Scaliger Castle, Parco Giardino Sigurtà, Ponte Visconteo, and the Valeggio tortellini, territorial excellence. It is located to the south of Lake Garda, where the moraine hills open into the Mincio Valley. After a brief ride, you can reach one of the most beautiful villages in Italy, Borghetto sul Mincio, testing the numerous cycle paths that run along the banks of the Mincio.

Here we are in the heart of the moraine hills, known around the world for its Custoza DOC wines and as the theatre of battle recalled by the Ossuary of Custoza - a suggestive monument with a breathtaking view.

You can't miss a visit to Fort Wohlgemuth in Rivoli Veronese: every Sunday from March to December, follow a guide to discover the military areas and listen to stories tied to these places.

Take an **e-bike tour** with a guide through the inland towns on the Veneto side of the lake, and even more! Stop for a visit with tastings at a historical winery.

Follow an Alpine guide in discovering **Monte Baldo**. Many **paths** await you here, each with a different difficulty and breathtaking views that cannot be missed.

Discover the Sanctuary of Madonna della Corona with a guide and enwrap yourself in the incredible beauty of this place.

Verona's mountain

Lessinia, with its authentic flavours, trips among Alpine huts and lodges, beech forests, and large sunny pastures, is the ideal destination for trekking enthusiasts, mountain bikers, horseback riders, and all sports and nature lovers.

Continue to discover this land and stop to listen to ancient legends, tasting local cheeses (this is the area of 'Monte veronese DOP' cheese) or the obligatory gnocchi di malga.

Walk through the Park and its numerous paths in the silence of the town quarters.

Let yourself be enchanted with natural bridges, fossil deposits and karstic cavities, from the Spluga della Preta, one of the deepest in Italy, to the rock cities in the Valle delle Sfingi, up to the Ponte di Veja.

- Ride a bike and discover the unique landscapes and flavours of the Lessinia.

- Enjoy an experience at a winery: from the wine cellar to the Library, an archive of historical vintages of Amarone della Valpolicella Classico, ending with a guided tasting.

Trying something special

- Try **rock climbing** with an Alpine guide. Rocky areas with routes of different difficulties await.
- Climb Monte Carega. An experience aimed at all trekking enthusiasts that want to learn to move safely, even on the most demanding paths.
- After a brief walk from the Valle delle Sfingi and from Sengio Rosso, reach one of the park lodges and enjoy an excellent lunch with the typical gnocchi di malga.
- Conquer the peak of Corno d'Aquilio, starting at the Grotta del Ciabattino to enjoy a 360° view of the entire Val d'Adige.

Trip through the lands of Soave – East Verona

Take time to visit the hills and valleys of **East Verona**, the cradle of some of the most prized Italian wines, such as the ancient, fresh Soave. The hills extend as far as the eye can see, appearing like one large vineyard, all to explore!

Many small and large companies here follow the ancient winemaking tradition of these volcanic soils and are dedicated to preserving the landscape and its biodiversity.

A site you absolutely must see is **Soave Castle**, the first Roman settlement, which can still be visited. The marvellous trip to discover the lands of Soave starts here.

Stop at the Museo Napoleonico 'G.A. Antonelli' in Arcole, a town known around the world for the battle that marked one of Napoleon Bonaparte's most important victories and also the end of the Republic of Venice.

Take a trip back in time and discover the places where fossils have been found. This is **Pesciara**, just outside Bolca, a deposit symbolizing Italian palaeontology.

An absolute must-see, a short ways from Soave, is the **Abbey of St Peter in San Bonifacio**. A magnificent expression of medieval architecture.

Of course, this is an area where it is impossible to get bored, among outdoor activities, such as mountain biking, trekking, and horse riding trips, or even tastings at wineries.



- Discover the freshness and variety of white wines produced in the Soave hills on a **tasting tour** starting in Verona. Explore the **medieval castle** and taste DOC and DOCG wines from this enchanting land.
- Visit a **fossil site** known worldwide for the abundance of fossils found and experience something unique: besides satisfying your curiosity in a dedicated museum, **play the role of a real archaeologist** and sift the ground for small fossils!




